POLICIES AND PLANNING FRAMEWORK

Kuala Lumpur 2040

- Address the needs of the homeless including temporary shelter, upskilling, access to healthcare and IP1.3 database for a targeted solution
- Enhance entrepreneurial opportunities in neighborhood areas such as utilising open or underutilised areas to IP1.6A generate neighborhood economy through community gardens
- Encourage the sharing of utility reserves, river resources and underutilised land for activities such as BM4.1 community gardens, nurseries and public recreational areas
- Encourage the use of roof tops and facilities reserves PR4.3(6) as a space for community gardens
- Increase green density vertically to include urban **SV1.3B** farming and parks
- Activate of parks and open spaces with edible green **SV2.1C** and urban farms





Shelter for the homeless in Kuala Lumpur

Homelessness remains a challenge for Kuala Lumpur due to unemployment and insufficient income to rent accommodation. In **2019**, Kuala Lumpur recorded a total of **1,128** homeless people in various parts of downtown Kuala Lumpur

There are **5 transit and shelter homes** for the homeless in Kuala Lumpur with minimal rental cost
