

Kuala Lumpur 2040


- Enhance entrepreneurial opportunities in neighborhood areas for all including women, homemakers, single mothers, B40 groups and people with disability

- Ensure that neighborhood development is inclusive and safe, taking into account residents age, gender, background and physical ability







4 Violence against women

In 2019, Kuala Lumpur recorded **36 domestic violence cases**, ranking as the **8th city nationwide**. Among the major causes to domestic violence are hot tempered intimate partners, drug addiction, financial difficulties and alcoholism.
